injection

interjection

n. a feeling word or

subject

v. to throw someone or

reject

v. to put something
aside or throw it
away

dejection

n. sadness and lack of hope; feeling thrown down in spirit

eject

v. to force or to throw somebody from a place or position

projectile

n. an object that can be launched or thrown through the air

trajectory

n. the path that a thrown object makes through space

projection

n. something thrown forward for viewing, analysis, or discussion
